
Attention Local Authors!

INHERITANCE

A Portrait of One Family's Inheritance of Addiction and Recovery

A new book by Kelley M. Moore

When Kelley's daughter was seventeen and a senior in high school, her entire world changed with the discovery of her daughter's alcohol and drug addiction. In her inspiring memoir, Moore shares the road to

recovery through the eyes of a mother, the intense emotional and physical turmoil it takes on not only the person afflicted with the disease, but to the entire family unit. She learns through her daughter's journey to sobriety of the generational effects, the inheritance of the disease from one generation to the next. The steps families can take to provide a positive and honest atmosphere for a family member's healing can heal everyone. Moore's own journey is a testament to the enormous role family can play in recovery. While her daughter fought, and still fights, to maintain sobriety, mother, father, sister, and daughter find themselves absorbed into new roles that the disease of addiction assigns to everyone. Moore discovers new lifelong passions for aiding others on their road to recovery.

Kelley M. Moore is an advocate for those individuals struggling with addiction and their families. She has dedicated her life to assisting others in finding their sobriety and has worked professionally in the addiction field for almost twenty years. 


